Background:

In order to meet the rapid growth towards more concentrated and specialized production in the European dairy sector, AEDIL (Association for European Dairy Industry Learning) took on a 3-years project with the aim of providing the sector with consolidated recommendations on training provision to meet the skills required by the labour market.

55 educational institutions, 120 dairy plants and 65 ex-students were interviewed in 14 countries.

Through the analysis of the data 4 major clusters of concern (or need for special attention) were identified:

- Digital Skills
- Green skills
- Recruitment
- Lifelong learning (dairy skills)
